

King Apple Parade Terms of Participation

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Pardee

General Parade Information:

- The Parade is held on Labor Day Monday at 2:30pm.
- The Parade goes on Rain or Shine.
- All entries must be in place NO LATER than 1:00 pm. (Fire Rescue Apparatus no later than 1:30)

Line-up Information:

- The Parade Lineup will be posted on our <u>website as soon as it is available</u>. **Please no phone** calls it will be posted.
- Parade staging information is also available on our website.
- Volunteers will be throughout the lineup area to assist you in locating your position.

Competitive Judging:

- Competitive judging is held for the Commercial/Business and Non-Profit categories. The judges are festival board members, and the parade staff and/or other community persons.
- Entries must be placed no later than 1:00 pm to be judged. The judges' decision is final, and awards are given to the winner in each category.
- Criteria include:
 - Best use of Apples
 - Best use of Theme
 - Originality
 - Attractiveness

Rules for all Entries:

- Throwing any items from a parade entry is PROHIBITED. Anyone caught throwing items may be removed from the parade route.
- Handing out anything to spectators on the parade route is prohibited.
- Due to security concerns, we do not allow enclosed box trucks or trailers. If you have concerns about this issue, please contact the office before the parade.
- All drivers must have a valid driver's license, which the police department will check before the start of the parade. This rule includes ATVs, golf carts, and other vehicles under power. All units are to exit ONLY at the designated point.
- No Commercial Entries will be allowed to participate without paying the fee. See the <u>Parade Application</u> for the amount. All fees must be submitted after completing the application.
- All marching, dancing, or performing arts units must keep moving. Units are not allowed to stop performing routines.
- Floats shall not be wider than 12 feet or above 13.5 feet.

Professional Leased Floats:

- Floats are supplied by a specialized company and are leased to the Festival. Interested groups can then lease them at our cost.
- All floats have two identification signs and are decorated and pulled by a towing vehicle driven by a professional driver. Please get in touch with the office concerning availability.

Commercial/Business Entries:

- Entries can be floats, vehicles, or walking entries.
- Please note that all vehicles must be decorated; placing a business sign does not count as being decorated, and thus will not be allowed to participate in the parade.
- The names of the entries should be prominently displayed.
- Commercial entries are entered into our judging process.
- Commercial entries may not participate without paying the fee.

Political Entries:

- All incumbent local, regional, state, and national elected officials are free to participate. The
 above will be placed at the beginning of the parade as a dignitary and must ride in a vehicle
 and cannot campaign. If a political official would like to campaign, they will be placed in the
 general parade and need to pay the \$100 fee.
- Political candidates, who are present and running for an office, are eligible to participate and must pay the \$100 fee.

Non-Profit Entries:

- This category covers local non-profit groups and there is no fee.
- Entries in this category are eligible for competitive judging.
- The name of the organization must be prominently displayed.

Bands/Marching Units:

- All local school bands are invited to participate.
- Position in the parade is rotated each year.
- Due to security concerns, we do not allow enclosed box trucks or trailers. If you have concerns about this issue, please get in touch with the office before the parade.

Fire/Rescue Entries:

- The use of sirens or horns is not allowed on the parade route.
- Arrive at the Parade Route after 1PM and before 1:30 PM

Antique Cars:

- Must be part of an established car club and can only enter the parade as a group, not as individuals. Any individual unit that applies for the parade will be denied.
- Car Clubs are responsible for ensuring all vehicles can move as part of the general parade.
 There is no pre-parade, and some vehicles will overheat at the slow pace of the parade. If a vehicle breaks down and delays the parade, that car club will not be invited back for future parades.
